Transaction Summary

The transaction closed on Nov 22 2016 and matures in Oct 2028. The pool's current aggregate principal balance is \$1096.3 million compared to \$1124.8 million at close.

The largest loan of the pool (7.3%) is secured by 9 West 57th Street - Trust located in New York-Jersey City-White Plains, NY-NJ metropolitan area. Occupancy at the subject was 76%. The major tenants included Kohlberg, Kravis, Roberts & Co. (11.67%) and Chanel Inc. (11.02%). The second largest loan of the pool (7.3%) is secured by 10 Hudson Yards - Trust located in New York-Jersey City-White Plains, NY-NJ metropolitan area. Occupancy at the subject was 100%. The major tenants included Coach (38.27%) and L'Oreal (22.68%). The third largest loan of the pool (5.9%) is secured by Starbucks Center located in Seattle-Bellevue-Everett, WA metropolitan area. Occupancy at the subject was 95%. The major tenants included Starbucks (85.08%) and Home Depot (6.90%).

The weighted average coupon (WAC) and the weighted average age (WALA) were 3.85% and 51 months as of 12/15/2020, respectively. There are a total of 36 loans and 42 properties in the portfolio. The appraisal LTV was approximately 54.1% compared to the Original loan to value (LTV), which was approximately 55.8%. The most recent weighted average Debt Service Coverage Ratio (DSCR) was 2.37x. As of 12/15/2020, no loan had a remaining term of less than 6 months. Weighted average occupancy was approximately 89%.

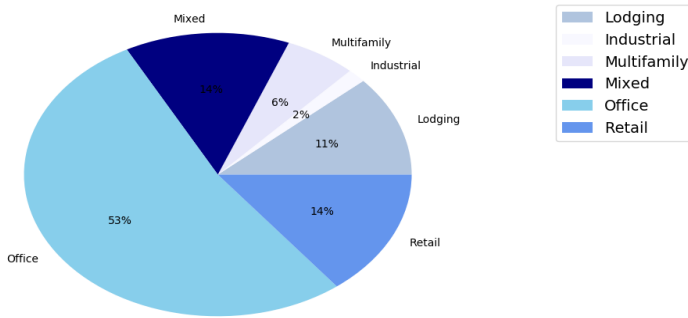

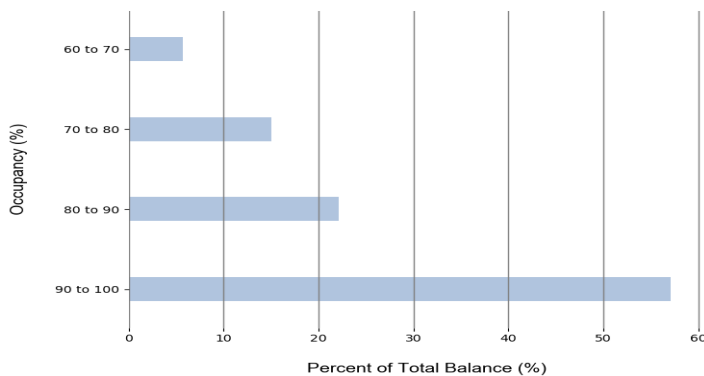

Occupancy Distribution (%)

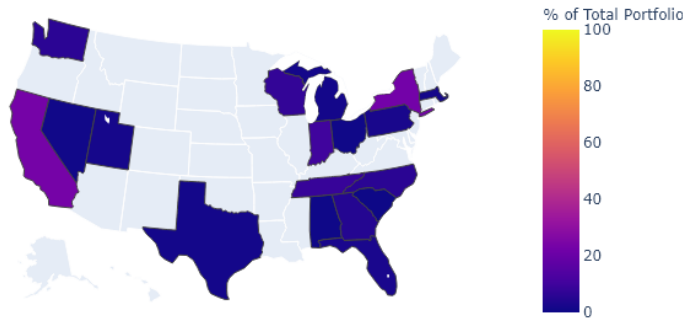

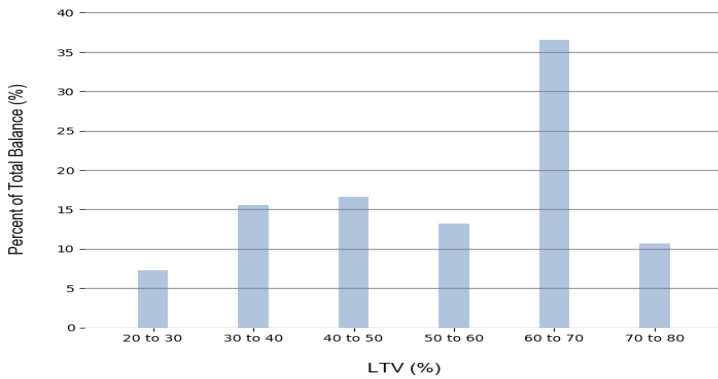
Local Distribution

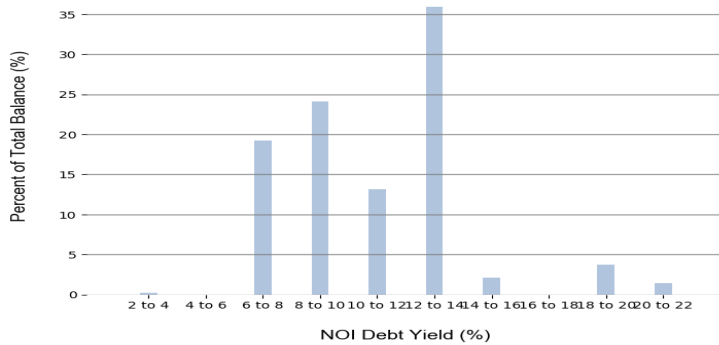

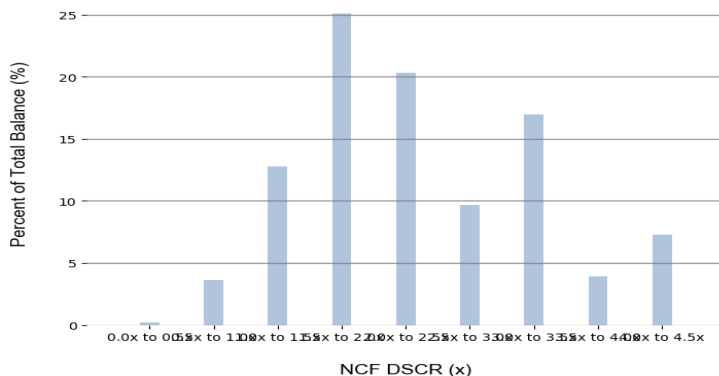
NOI Debt Yield (%)



Most recent net operating income debt yield ranged from 2% to 21% with a weighted average NOI debt yield of 11.0%. NOI debt yield ranged from 2% to 21%. There were 1 assets (0% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 2% and 4%, 6 assets (19% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 6% and 8%, 7 assets (24% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 8% and 10%, 7 assets (13% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 10% and 12%, 10 assets (36% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 12% and 14%, 2 assets (2% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 14% and 16%, 1 assets (4% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 18% and 20%, 2 assets (1% of total balance) with NOI debt yield between 20% and 22%

Net Cash Flow DSCR (x)

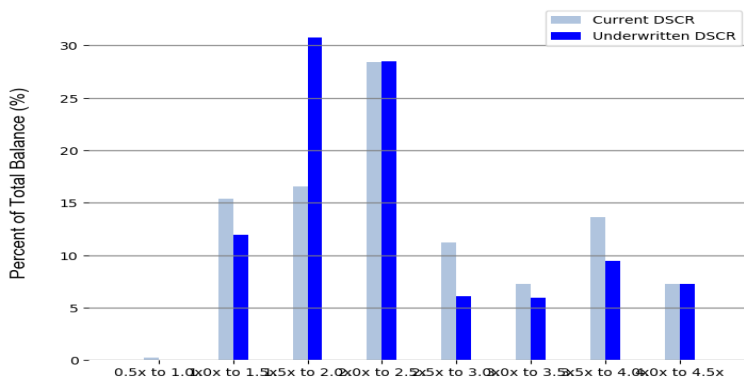


NCF DSCR ranged from 0.0x to 4.0x. There were 1 assets (0.2% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 0.0x and 0.5x, 2 assets (3.6% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 0.5x and 1.0x, 6 assets (12.8% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 1.0x and 1.5x, 9 assets (25.1% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 1.5x and 2.0x, 8 assets (20.3% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 2.0x and 2.5x, 5 assets (9.6% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 2.5x and 3.0x, 3 assets (17.0% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 3.0x and 3.5x, 1 assets (3.9% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 3.5x and 4.0x and 1 assets (7.3% of total balance) with NCF DSCR between 4.0x and 4.5x. 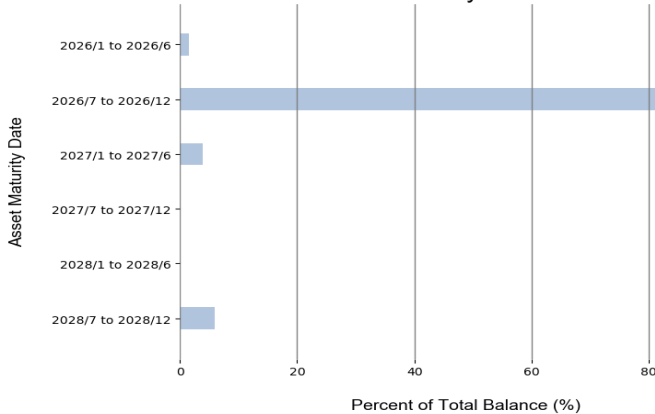
DSCR Distribution (x)



DSCRs ranged from 0.5x to 4.5x. There are 1 assets (0.2% of total balance) with DSCR between 0.5x and 1.0x, 7 assets (15.4% of total balance) with DSCR between 1.0x and 1.5x, 7 assets (16.5% of total balance) with DSCR between 1.5x and 2.0x, 10 assets (28.4% of total balance) with DSCR between 2.0x and 2.5x, 6 assets (11.2% of total balance) with DSCR between 2.5x and 3.0x, 1 assets (7.3% of total balance) with DSCR between 3.0x and 3.5x, 3 assets (13.6% of total balance) with DSCR between 3.5x and 4.0x and 1 assets (7.3% of total balance) with DSCR between 4.0x and 4.5x. The most recent weighted average DSCR is 2.6x.

There are 1 assets (1.6% of total balance) that have maturity dates between 2026/1 and 2026/6, 33 assets (88.6% of total balance) that have maturity dates between 2026/7 and 2026/12, 1 assets (3.9% of total balance) that have maturity dates between 2027/1 and 2027/6 and 1 assets (5.9% of total balance) that have maturity dates between 2027/7 and 2027/12.

EJR's Key Rating Features & Differences Compared With Other NRSROs

Below is a summary of EJ's approach (see our Methodology for rating Commercial Mortgage Backed Securities (CMBS) (Non-NRSRO) for more complete description):

1. Our ratings are derived from Loan to Value estimates (LTVs) and calculated Estimated Losses (ELs). The ELs are then compared to our EL matrices to derive the implied ratings.
2. To reflect the current bearish credit conditions, we have discounted reported pool assets' Net Cashflow (NCF) by 20% for the Base Case.
3. EJ's analysis is conducted using information and cash flow engines supplied by a recognized industry service provider.
4. Subject to economic conditions, EJ may cap its highest rating at "AA" and apply an additional downgrade of up to two notches for each tranche.

We are using the Methodology for Rating Commercial Mortgage Backed Securities (CMBS) (Non-NRSRO) v1a and General Methodology for Rating Asset Backed and Structured Finance Obligations (Non-NRSRO) v1.

3. The main assumptions and principles used in constructing the procedures and methodologies used to determine the credit rating as required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(C) of Rule 17g-7:

The credit rating assigned reflects EJR's judgement regarding the future credit quality of the issue. The major assumptions used to construct the methodologies include:

- 1). Past data reflects the performance and credit worthiness of the pooled assets and is useful for analysis.
- 2). Financial and credit information that EJR gets from the issuer or the third party is reliable and accurate.
- 3). The economy and regulation policies will remain stable in the foreseeable future.

Specific quantitative assumptions used in this credit analysis applied to the collateral assets, which include Loan-to-Value analysis and Cash flow analysis.

Asset diversification is not considered in this report.

4. The potential limitations of the credit rating as required by Paragraph (a)(1)(ii)(D) of Rule 17g-7:

EJR's rating pertains solely to EJR's view of current and prospective credit quality. EJR's rating does not address pricing, liquidity or other risks associated with holding investments in the issuer. EJR ratings:
